CHAPTER 282.

PUBLIC NOTICES.

(28th January, 1908.)

1. This Act may be cited as the Public Notices Act.

2. In this Act—

"document" includes any application, appointment, bylaw, jury list, minute of proceedings, notification, notice, order, proceedings, request, return, or rule.

"local newspaper" means a newspaper (if any) published in the Colony.

3. Where by any Act or Ordinance passed before or after the commencement of this Act or by any by-law, regulation, or instrument made thereunder it is prescribed that any document, matter, meeting, sale, or thing of any kind whatsoever or notice of such document, matter, meeting, sale, or thing shall be published or advertised in any local newspaper whether in addition to publication or advertisement thereof in the Gazette or not, it shall be lawful for the Administrator in Council, notwithstanding the provisions of any such Act or Ordinance, bylaw, regulation, or instrument, to order and direct that such document, matter, meeting, sale or thing, or notice thereof shall be published or advertised in such manner and form as the Administrator in Council may in and by such order prescribe.

4. Every such order of the Administrator in Council may be in either special or general terms and shall be published in the Gazette; and every publication and advertisement made in pursuance of such order shall have the same force and effect as if the same had been published or advertised in a local newspaper (if any) as originally directed by the Act, Ordinance, bylaw, regulation, or instrument requiring the same to be published or advertised.

Notices required by law to be inserted in

local newspaper may be published as Administrator in Council shall direct.
