THE RUM DUTY REGULATIONS, MADE UNDER SECTION 69 OF
THE RUM DUTY ORDINANCE.

1. SHORT TITLE. These Regulations may be cited as the Rum Duty Regulations.

2. STOCK BOOK. (1) Every distiller shall keep a stock book in the distillery in which shall be entered the distillations as they are made, and all deliveries from the distillery with the dates thereof. In recording the deliveries the name and address of the person or persons to whom the rum is delivered should be entered at the time of such deliveries. A record shall also be kept of the various casks or packages in which the rum is deposited with an entry of the strength of proof by Sykes Hydrometer.

(2) The stock book kept in any distillery shall be available for inspection by any Government Officer at any hour between sunrise and sunset.

3. APPLICATIONS FOR PERMITS. All applications for permits for the removal of spirits from any distillery shall be addressed to the Treasurer in writing, and shall state the name and address of the person to whom the rum is destined, and the manner in which the rum is to be conveyed to its destination. It should also contain particulars of the quantity of rum to be delivered, and its strength of proof by Sykes Hydrometer.

4. PERMITS. Every permit issued by the Treasurer should contain the particulars required by Regulation 3 to be entered in the application for a permit and also a statement of the time during which such permit shall be in force.

5. QUANTITIES TO BE REMOVED FROM DISTILLERY. No spirits shall be removed from any distillery in quantities less than twenty gallons.

6. PENALTY. Any person who shall fail to comply with these Regulation shall be liable, on summary conviction, to a fine not exceeding \$240.

7. PUBLICATION. These Regulations shall be published in the *Gazette*, and a copy thereof duly signed by the Administrator shall be sufficient proof thereof in a Court of Law.

CHAPTER 126.

RUM (REFUND OF DUTY) ORDINANCE.
